Miki and I alsomet with two Josai International University students Rina and Tomoenielynwho will be coming to Camosun College this September. We're really looking forward to welcomingthem!





SCOP∉ LIMITS

This policy applies to all domestic and international applicants seeking admission to Camosun Cellege Formatted: Left credentialed progams.

Programs specifically intended to prepare students for direct entry into upper levels of further or advanced programs at partner institutions shall be governed by the admission requirements of those institutions.

- IV NEW BUSINESS

1. Financial Management Report for the ine Months to December 3,12022 Mike Stubbing, Chair, Finance Committee, noted the review is of the first three quarters of the fiscal year, which is the nine months from April 1 to December 31, 2022. At this pointmein year, the projections are reasonably solid.

Deborah Huelscher, VP Administration & CFO, reported a deficit balance of \$5,137,215 against a budgeted deficit of \$8,592,689, resulting in a positive variance of \$3,455,4**Dece**mber 31. The quarterly reviews with the Deans and Directors have just been completed. Deborah reviewed the results for each activity area. Itaigood news story, and a large piece of that is from international student tuition. Domestic enrollment has declined slightlyhere are only three months remaining, so if we stay on track, the forecast to March 31, 2023, is a deficit of \$1.2M or less. The results will inform the budget for 2023/2024. We made the formal request to the Ministries of Finance and Pe**Se**condaryEducation and Future Skills for approval of a \$2.7M deficit.
